


Overview

- o Work area
- Tools
 - Item tool
 - Content tool
- Menus
 - Contextually-sensitive Style menu
- Palettes
 - Measurements
- o Views
 - Actual Size: Command-1Fit to Window: Command-0
 - Zoom In: Command-+
 - Zoom Out: Command--
 - Switch cursor temporarily to the Hand tool: Option key
 - Redraw content while dragging: Click-and-pause

Content Boxes

- o Boxes are defined by what they contain:
 - Picture
 - Text
 - Nothing (None)
- o Box Samples





 $\circ\quad$ Boxes can be almost any shape, including Bézier curves.

- o Boxes can be converted from one type to another
 - Use the Item > Content > Option menu to change box types.
 - Existing content will be removed when the type is changed.

Modifications

- o Most changes to a container box can be made through the Modify menu.
 - Item > Modify (Command-M)

Working with Images

- Creating new picture boxes
- Importing images
 - With the content tool, select a picture box and select the File > Get Picture... menu item (Command-E).
- Positioning an image inside a picture box with the Content tool.
- Scaling an Image
 - Command-Option-Shift-F: Fit the image into the vertical dimension of the hox.
 - Command-Option-Shift-Drag: Resize the box and image at the same time.
 - Use either the Measurements palette or the Modify (Command-M) dialog box to scale an image numerically.

Working with Type

- Creating new text boxes
- Importing text
 - With the content tool, select a text box and select the File > Get Text... menu item (Command-E).
- Defining columns
 - Item > Modify, then select the Text tab
- Linking between text boxes
 - Allows text to flow from one text box to another
 - Using the Link and Unlink tools
- Working with runaround
- o Formatting with the Measurements palette

Defining Colors

- Use Edit > Colors... to define and edit colors.
- Use View > Show Colors (F12) to display the Color palette.
- Border, Text and Fill color options
- Drag and drop of colors is NOT supported in QuarkXPress.

Defining Styles

- Styles allow you to create a pre-defined set of character and paragraph settings and apply them simultaneously to text in a document.
- Use Edit > Style Sheets... to define and edit styles.
- Use View > Show Style Sheets (F11) to display the Style Sheet palette.
